Gamma Delta was the student organization of the Lutheran Church - Missouri Synod in the early years of University Lutheran Assembly at CU. A recently recovered photograph of the group in 1960-61 has a good number of active ULC alumni among the 34 members (please see page 5). The article marks a special time in the history of our Campus Ministry: “The highlight of the year for the Gamma Deltas was a change of address. The Lutheran organization moved from the basement of the Grace Lutheran Church to their own property on the corner of 24th Street and Pennsylvania” (now Folsom and Colorado).

James Niquette is an alumnus of the mid-1960s. Pastor Bob Stuenkel was brought into contact with him

at the Rotary District 5450 Conference by **Norris Hermsmeyer**, a “Gamma Deltan” of that same era. James is a Regional Leader with Primerica in Denver, a life insurance and financial investment company, and a member of the Rotary Club of Wheat Ridge.

Deborah Hage (MS '77) was recognized by the same Rotary District for her service with free community dinners - and the 100,000th meal: “Deborah Hage initiated the dinners in 2009 after becoming aware that the area food banks were overwhelmed serving workers, children and families.”

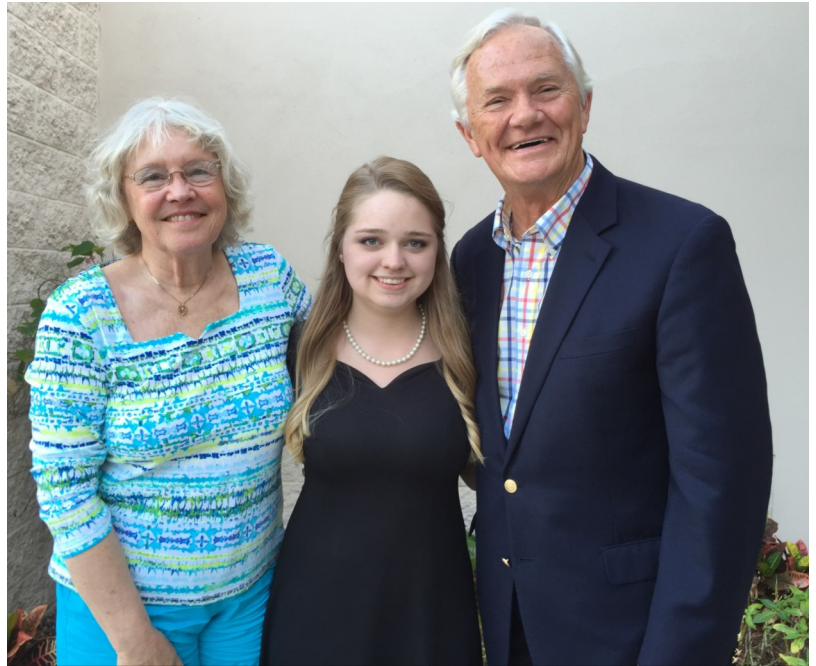

“Home-Goings” - Deaths of Alumni

Evan Curtis Bell, a CU alumnus and member of ULC with his wife **Margie (Werner)** (CU '65), died in Bakersfield, California on 14 January 2015. He was 80 years young. Evan taught at Vista High School in Bakersfield from 1967 to 2002. He worked on various literature and writing projects over the years and mentored teachers throughout the district. Margie wrote: “I’m very proud of the work he [Evan] did with problem students.” His inurnment was at the Bakersfield National Cemetery.

Loren Otto (CU '62) was listed in the In Memoriam section of the Summer 2015 Coloradoan - Alumni Magazine. We learned more about Loren’s death in an online obituary. He “passed away in the San Luis Medical Center on February 22, 2015, following a three-and-a-half year battle with cancer... Loren was a man of strong faith and beliefs, and he was a stalwart member of St. Peter’s Lutheran Church in Monte Vista, CO...” A Memorial Service was held at St. Peter’s on 15 July 2015. Loren was a CU honors graduate in electrical engineering and an active leader in the early years of University Lutheran Assembly.

Donald Kenneth Schwartz, a member of ULC until 2003 together with his wife **Myrt**, died on 11 June 2015 at a care center in south Denver. Don was 93 years young. He had served as a CU staff member for thirty years and in 1983 retired as Director of Buying and Contracting. After retiring, Don received a Master of Theology degree from St. Thomas Seminary, and he drew upon this study as a Bible study leader in our Campus Ministry. The Memorial Service was held at Bethany Lutheran Church in Englewood, CO.

Robert Allen Ahrens, a former member of ULC with his wife **Irene**, died in Boulder on 9 September 2015. Bob had received his masters degree in counseling at CU and was a counselor for some thirty years at Baseline Jr. High and at Boulder High School. The Memorial Service was held at Grace Lutheran, Boulder, where Bob had been a member for 43 years. Bob’s philosophy of life was stated as “Keep the faith, Love one another, Let the world spin.”

James Williams, a ULC member in the 1960s and a long-time choir member at Grace Lutheran, passed away in mid-January 2016. Jim was a gifted vocalist and youth choir leader. He worked and taught in the sciences. Jim’s Memorial Service was at St. Stephen’s Lutheran Church in Northglenn, CO.

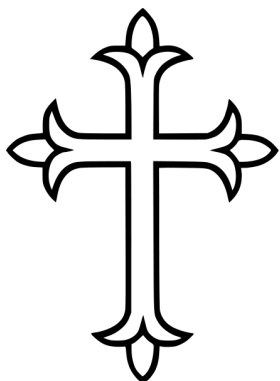

James (Jim) Wilbur Swaebly, active in ULA Campus Ministry during the 1960s with his wife Susan (CU '67), died on 14 March 2016. Jim married **Susan Geer** in 1970 at ULC, and they continued at Grace Lutheran Church, Boulder, over the years. Jim was a banker and Commercial Real Estate Broker with the Colorado Group in Boulder for 26 years. Jim was an active ULC alumnus with close friend Norris Hermes-meyer, and he served as Board Chair for Lutheran Family Services - Rocky Mountain. In Jim's Memorial Service at Grace, a statement reflected Jim's spirit: "If you wish to honor Jim's memory, please do an unexpected act of kindness or generosity for someone less privileged."

Philip Stephan, pastor at ULC from 1971-77, had made Tucson, Arizona, his home for the past decade. We have learned through mutual friends in the Tucson area that Pr. Phil had Louie Body disease and was in advanced stages of dementia. The announcement of Dr. Philip Stephan's death on 12 January 2016 came to us in the August issue of *Living Lutheran*. It simply states: "Serving LCMS calls from 1961 - 1977; counselor, Samaritan Counseling Center, Denver; counselor, Presbyterian Counseling Service, Snohomish, WA." Our ULC Alumni know Pastor Phil's ministry very personally, and we give thanks to God for his life and ministry.

Daniel A.S. D'Ippolito died peacefully at home in Erie, CO, on 3 April 2016 after a battle with pancreatic cancer. He was 66 years young. Dan was often a part of ULC with friends James Myra and Donna Rohde (CU '63) after joining Science Applications Inc. in 1979 and in 1987 Lodestar Research Corporation in Boulder retiring as President in 2016. He is survived by his wife of 31 years, **Nancy**. The Memorial Service was at Westview Presbyterian Church in Longmont, CO.



Dr. Christian Kopff, Associate Professor of Classics at CU, was featured in an article of the September-October 2015 *LUTHERANSengage* entitled "Examining the Evidence for Faith." While Professor Kopff's specialty is ancient Greek manuscripts, he also teaches a course called "Introduction to the Bible" from an historical perspective. The article, which was also used as a call to identify Lutheran professors at other colleges and universities, gives this helpful description: "In addition to challenging his students to think critically inside the classroom, Kopff also takes an active role at University Lutheran Chapel (ULC), the Synod's LCMS U campus ministry chapter at the University of Colorado by serving as an elder."

Pastor Joshua Hayes was born outside of Seattle, Washington, but also grew up in Houston, Texas. He attended college at Concordia University Chicago where he met his wife, **Diane**. He then attended Washington University in St. Louis, Missouri and received his M.A. in Classics while also attending Concordia Seminary for his M.Div.
